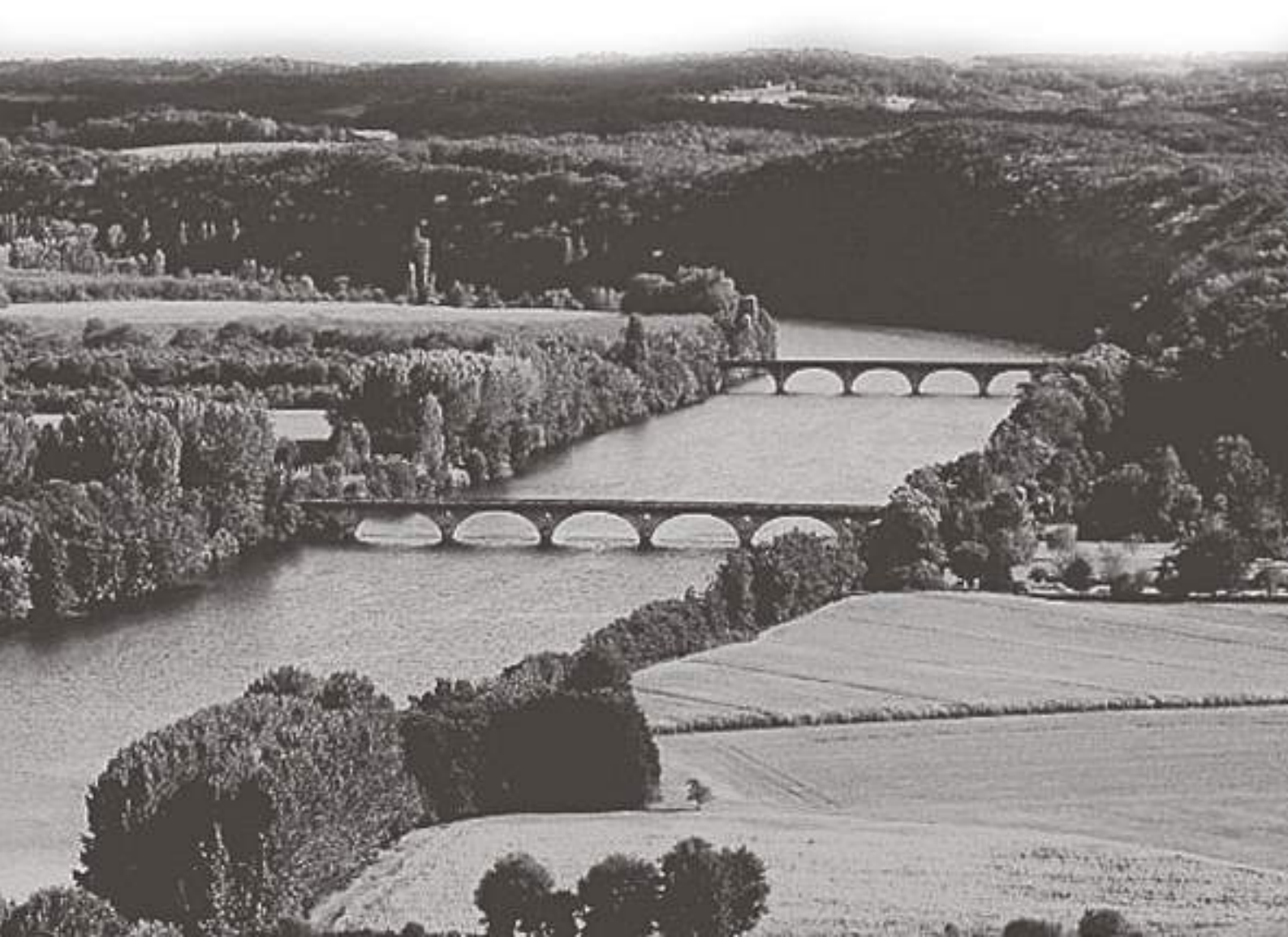

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CHÂTEAU HAUT-BRION

1er GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – PESSAC-LÉOGNAN ROUGE

About 2000 years ago, small quartz stones called gravels were discovered by the Romans in the area of Château Haut-Brion. These gravelly soils, in combination with a unique subsoil of clay, sand, and limestone, help to ensure natural drainage. The first mention of a wine specifically designated as having been produced on these soils dates back to 1521.

By acquiring Château Haut-Brion in 1935, Clarence Dillon returned it to the limited circle of the most legendary wines in the world. This extraordinary vision, continues with the 4th generation of the family, embodied by its president, Prince Robert of Luxembourg. Located in the town of Pessac, just a few kilometers from Bordeaux, Château Haut-Brion – the first of three estates acquired by the Dillon family – is the oldest wine property in the region.



CHÂTEAU HAUT-BRION 2015 (Ref# 103)

50% Merlot, 42% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Cabernet Franc

"The medium to deep garnet-purple colored 2015 Haut-Brion is reticent to begin, languidly revealing crushed black cherries, ripe black plums and wild blueberries with sparks of cinnamon stick, cloves, nutmeg, espresso, unsmoked cigars, tapenade, crushed rocks and lavender. The full-bodied palate possesses wonderfully complementary contrasts of bold black and blue fruit richness and delicately nuanced cherry fruit, baking spices and floral accents, strutting ripe, finely pixelated tannins and seamless acidity that is placed firmly in the background, finishing very long and with plenty of attitude. This impeccably poised, exquisitely perfumed 2015 Haut-Brion possesses the most alluring yet seemingly effortless beauty..."

1er GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – PAUILLAC

Château Lafite Rothschild, a timeless masterpiece shaped across a thousand seasons, embodies an unparalleled harmony with nature. Nestled upon Lafite’s storied gravel plateau, they have been custodians for over 150 years, upholding wine-growing traditions. From its 112 hectare expanse to the historical Lafite cedar, this sanctuary echoes a legacy of resilience, passed through generations, crafting wines that transcend time amidst a landscape steeped in history.



CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD 1990 (Ref# 104)

64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 36% Merlot

“Medium garnet-brick colour. Earthy, Provence herb seasoned aromas of warm cassis and stewed plum with nuances of smoked duck, cracked black pepper and dark soy. The palate leads with structure – medium to high, finely grained tannins and medium to high acid. Plenty of complex fruit to flesh out the mid-palate with a long, layered finish. Drink now – 2030+. Tasted February 2009.”

CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD 2003 (Ref# 105)

86% Cabernet Sauvignon, 9% Merlot, 3% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot

“The 2003 Lafite Rothschild comes as close to perfection as any of the great Lafites made over the past three decades (1982, 1986, 1996, 2000, 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2010). This sensational effort came in at 12.7% natural alcohol, it is made in the style of one of this estate’s great classics, the 1959. It exhibits a dense ruby/purple color to the rim along with a luxurious bouquet of cedarwood, lead pencil shaving, white chocolate, cocoa and cassis. Fat, rich, opulent and full-bodied with low acidity and stunning seductiveness and complexity, this noble wine possesses a bountiful, generous, heady style.”

CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD 2016 (Ref# 106)

92% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Merlot

“What I love about the 2016 Lafite is that the sweetness of the fruit comes through even at this early stage. Sweet, ripe blackberry and cassis pulse through the palate behind the tight construction of tension and classicism given by high acidity and plenty of tannins. It has ripeness and a sense of promise but, as is often the case with a young Lafite, it's not giving a lot away and we can expect it to age for many decades perfectly comfortably. Extremely accomplished, one to cherish. Matured in 100% new oak”.

CHÂTEAU LATOUR

1er GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – PAUILLAC

Since its genesis in 1331, Château Latour has stood as a sentinel, its storied history intertwining with pivotal moments in French heritage. From fortifying Saint Maubert during the Hundred Years War to Alexandre de Ségur's reign as the "Prince of the Vines," this estate's narrative brims with resilience and vinicultural prowess. François Pinault's stewardship from 1993 heralded an era of transformation, culminating in meticulous renovations and an unyielding commitment to excellence. It's unparalleled location, sheltered by the Atlantic's embrace and estuarine guardianship, tempers the Médoc's capricious climate, infusing each vintage with a distinctive essence. From mild winters to diverse springs, warm summers to crisp autumns, Château Latour's wines echo the symphony of nature's cycles.

CHÂTEAU MARGAUX

1er GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – MARGAUX

Château Margaux, born in the XII century as "La Mothe de Margaux," evolved from a vineless mound to a wine legend. The Lestonnac family laid its viticultural foundation. Banker-turned-aficionado, Alexandre Aguado, brought flair, Berlon innovated, André Mentzelopoulos revived, and Corinne Mentzelopoulos propels this legacy.

Amidst turmoil, Château Margaux persevered. Its narrative spans centuries, showcasing architectural splendor and nurturing a cherished terroir. From its humble origins to its apex in Bordeaux's winemaking history, the estate's journey — of transformation, resilience, and relentless pursuit of excellence — resonates. It's a saga that breathes life into every bottle, an epic of artistry and ageability in the realm of fine wine.



CHÂTEAU MARGAUX 2006 (Ref# 110)

90% Cabernet Sauvignon, 4% Merlot, 4% Petit Verdot, 2% Cabernet Franc

"This has more intensity on the nose than the 2007, certainly less Burgundian, with blacker fruit with boysenberry, wild hedgerow, a touch of smoke and violets. Good definition. The palate is medium-bodied, a little more structure and weight than the 2007, a little more grip and persistency. Touches of blackberry, cedar, blueberry, nice crescendo towards the finish. Very fine clarity with a slight graininess on the finish. Tasted June 2009."

"The purity of cabernet sauvignon fruit is what impresses here. Subtle and energetic plum and currant aromas follow through to a gorgeously harmonized palate of wonderful fruit and an ultra-long finish. Current bush and light earth add to the complexity. Lasts for minutes. Drink in 2022."

CHÂTEAU COS D'ESTOURNEL

2ème GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – SAINT-ESTÈPHE

In a saga brimming with defiance and innovation, Cos d'Estournel's legacy began with Louis Gaspard d'Estournel, a maverick who defied norms. His wines voyaged afar; each bottle signed—a rebellion against tradition. India's admiration for his wines reshaped the estate's future.

The "Returned from India" wines emerged from a sea-enriched journey, christening d'Estournel the "Maharajah of Saint-Estèphe." At Cos d'Estournel, artisans blend tradition with avant-garde techniques, nurturing vines with unwavering dedication. Pioneering isothermal vats and a backdrop of Médoc's undulating landscapes weave into a saga crafting globally revered wines.



CHÂTEAU COS D'ESTOURNEL 2014 (Ref# 116)

65% Cabernet Sauvignon, 33% Merlot, 2% Cabernet Franc

"If you want to know what St.-Estèphe smells like, this is it. Aromas of spices, black truffles, forest floor, dried strawberries and tar. It's full-bodied yet pinpointed on the palate with fabulous density and richness. It's opulent but in a reserved and checked way. This needs at least five or six years to come around, but it's already fantastic. What harmony and structure. Try in 2022 if you can keep your hands off it!"

CHÂTEAU COS D'ESTOURNEL 2016 (Ref# 117)

76% Cabernet Sauvignon, 23% Merlot, 1% Cabernet Franc

"Bottled in July 2018, it is deep garnet-purple colored and starts off a little closed and reticent, opening out slowly and seductively to reveal beautiful lilacs, rose hip tea, crushed stones and camphor nuances over a core of crème de cassis, kirsch, wild blueberries and mocha plus wafts of incense and wood smoke. The palate is simply electric, charged with an energy and depth of flavors that seem to defy the elegance and ethereal nature of its medium-bodied weight, featuring super ripe, densely pixelated tannins that firmly frame the myriad of fruit and floral sparks, finishing with epic length. Just. Magic."

CHÂTEAU COS D'ESTOURNEL 2018 (Ref# 118)

74% Cabernet Sauvignon, 23% Merlot, 2% Cabernet Franc, 1% Petit Verdot

"Sporting a deep purple-black color, it needs a lot of swirling to begin to unlock a powerful nose of crème de cassis, stewed plums, wild blueberries and chocolate-covered cherries, followed by nuances of Sichuan pepper, star anise, tree and clove oil, plus a waft of charcoal. The full-bodied palate is densely packed with taut, muscular black fruits and earthy layers, framed by super firm, ripe, grainy tannins and seamless freshness, finishing very long and wonderfully earthy. A very impressive behemoth, this is going to need a good seven to 10 years to truly show its stuff and should drink for a good 40 years and beyond."

"The finest bottle I've had of this wine (which came from the estate), the 1982 Château Ducru-Beaucaillou continues to drink brilliantly and is a magical Saint-Julien. Still healthy ruby hued with a mature yet insanely complex bouquet of sweet red and black fruits, cedary herbs, graphite, tobacco, and forest floor, it's powerful yet seamless on the palate, with resolved tannins, no hard edges, and a fabulous finish. This is mature Bordeaux in all its glory. Drink bottles any time over the coming two decades."

"A gorgeously silky, juicy and balanced glass of wine, this combines elegant richness of sweet cocoa and blackberry, with tons of power and a feeling of holding itself in check. This is signature St Julien, concentrated yet delicate, just an utterly lovely wine that has good acidity, with tannins that have melted into the rest of the structure and fruit that is still absolutely in control, followed by a saline edge to the finish. There's a long road ahead still, but this is a standout Ducru."

CHÂTEAU DUCRU-BEAUCAILLOU 2010 (Ref# 121)

"In comparison to the more showy, sexy 2009, the 2010 Château Ducru-Beaucaillou cuts a very different profile, with a more focused, pure, regal style that will stop any wine lover in their tracks. Pure crème de cassis, graphite, fresh tobacco, and lead pencil (there's an almost Pauillac edge here) define the aromatics, and it hits the palate with full-bodied richness, a deep, concentrated, incredibly layered mouthfeel, absolutely perfect tannins, and a great, great finish. It's absolutely mind-blowingly good today yet has 50, 60, 75+ years of longevity ahead of it."

CHÂTEAU LÉOVILLE LAS CASES

2ème GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – SAINT JULIEN

Embark on a journey through time at Domaine de Léoville, a storied Medoc estate tracing its origins to the 17th century. Witnessing the upheavals of history, the estate was born anew during the French Revolution, resulting in the birth of Château Léoville Las Cases. The Grand Vin's terroir, steeped in centuries of legacy, remains the heart of the original domain. Guided by successive heirs, the estate found its steward in the late 19th century with Théophile Skawinski, continuing its legacy to this day under Jean-Hubert Delon's leadership. Amidst this history lies an exceptional terroir — a mosaic of Quaternary gravel, gravelly sand, and clay. These geological intricacies imbue the grapes with their distinct character, defining the timeless personality of this exceptional wine.

"A classic in development, a wine that will last for decades. It is certainly powerful, but already the shape is finalized, with its plums and berries settling down with perfumes, acidity, just enough tannins and a warm, welcoming richness. A great argument for the superiority of 2001 over 2000."

"Very clear and translucent with currants, blueberries and fresh mushrooms. Full-bodied with velvety tannins that are layered and beautiful. Together and polished with plushness and beauty. Drink or hold."

CHÂTEAU LÉOVILLE POYFERRÉ 2006 (Ref# 126)

"A superb Poyferre from Didier Cuvelier. This is very ripe on the nose, good lift but it has a lot of oak at the moment, with black plum, cassis, orange sorbet and subtle honeyed aromas. The palate is full-bodied, decadent, grippy tannins that coat the mouth, very primal, dense blackberry, cassis, tar and cedar, weighty on the finish. This needs serious time to mellow out, but it is unequivocally a class act."

"Pure gold, the 2010 Château Léoville Poyferré, which was drunk beside a perfect 2009 Latour, offers everything you could want from wine. Sporting a deep purple hue as well as an incredible array of crème de cassis, graphite, damp earth, leafy tobacco, and beautifully integrated oak, it hits the palate with an incredible amount of fruit and opulence while always staying pure, precise, and as seamless as they come. It shows the density and power of the 2010 vintage, but it's remarkable in its balance, purity, and length. As with most 2010s today, it's still youthful and certainly in its early drinking plateau and has another 40-50 years of prime drinking."

CHÂTEAU MONTROSE

2ème GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – SAINT-ESTÈPHE

Entwined in Montrose's legacy lies a saga scripted by three dynasties, weaving aspirations of excellence into this historic estate. Spanning 95 hectares, the vineyard envelops the Château and winery in rare unison, fostering ideal conditions for parcel monitoring. In 2006, Martin and Olivier Bouygues embraced Montrose, orchestrating a seven-year renaissance, honouring tradition while embracing innovation. The estate now boasts a majestic barrel hall powered by geothermal prowess and rooftop solar panels. Guided by Melissa Bouygues, Montrose thrives, uniting expertise in a testament to its timeless allure. This tale harmonizes heritage with sustainability, exemplifying the estate's enduring charm and commitment to excellence.



CHÂTEAU MONTROSE 2014 (Ref# 129)

61% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 8% Cabernet Franc 1% Petit Verdot

"The 2014 Montrose is without the question one of the standout wines of the vintage. Black cherry, plum, smoke, licorice and lavender are some of the many aromas and flavors that open up in the glass. But the 2014 is a much deeper wine than just a bunch of descriptors can conjure. In 2014, Montrose is a wine of exceptional finesse and polish. The late-ripening vintage allowed for perfect maturation off the tannins and resulted in a silky wine that exudes class and pedigree. The 2014 is not an obvious or bombastic Montrose, but rather a wine of sublime enchantment. Don't miss it!"

CHÂTEAU MONTROSE 2016 (Ref# 130)

"Unquestionably one of the top 2-3 wines of the vintage, the 2016 Château Montrose is a monument in the making. Checking in as a blend of 68% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Merlot, and 7% Cabernet Franc raised in 60% new French oak (the balance was in once-used barrels) and representing a tiny 36% of the production, this deep purple-colored 2016 possesses powerful, incredibly classic Saint-Estephe notes of creme de cassis, graphite, damp earth, lead pencil shavings, and burning embers. With a powerful, full-bodied style on the palate, a huge mid-palate, lots of underlying structure and tannic grip, and perfect balance, this magical wine will need upwards of a decade or cellaring and keep for 40-50 years."

CHÂTEAU PICHON-LONGUEVILLE BARON

2ème GRAND CRU CLASSÉ 1855 – PAULLIAC

Within the revered Pauillac appellation, Château Pichon Baron stands as a testament to centuries of winemaking. Originating from the 17th century, Pierre Desmeasures de Rauzan laid the groundwork for this prestigious estate. The 19th-century saw its evolution — division into Pichon Baron and Pichon Comtesse, and the birth of the iconic château, acclaimed during the 1855 Universal Exhibition. Modernized by AXA Millésimes, the estate merges tradition and innovation, preserving the 19th-century charm while embracing contemporary practices. 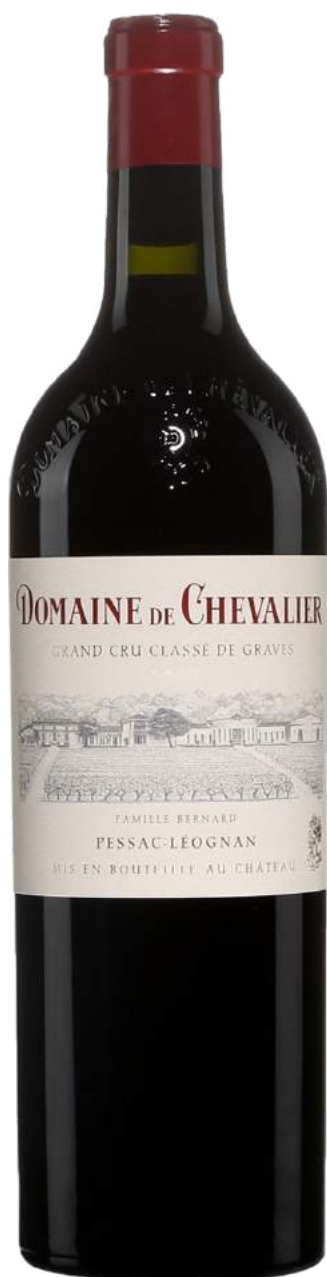

On the palate, the wine asserts itself with a powerful, upright structure without any heaviness whatsoever, as the tannic framework is so finely drawn and elegantly proportioned. Its expression is certainly less exuberant than that of its 2018 counterpart, but this wine is a paragon of precision as well as of thoroughbred poise and energy. This is an immense Figeac of true grandeur that will stay the distance for up to five decades while giving precocious pleasure to impatient enthusiasts."

CHÂTEAU BÉLAIR-MONANGE

AOC POMEROL

Château Bélaïr-Monange, with roots tracing back to Roman times, underwent a fascinating evolution. In the 1st century AD, Bordeaux vineyards embraced wooden barrels, elevating the aging process. The Middle Ages witnessed Saint-Émilion's prominence as vines thrived around Villeneuve. In the 16th century, Jean Despagne's vines laid the groundwork for Bélaïr.

Despite challenges in the French Revolution, Bélaïr endured, and in 1802, it pioneered on-site bottling. The 19th century brought international acclaim, leading to a Premier Grand Cru Classé status in 1955. In 2008, Christian and Edouard Moueix revived tradition, renaming it Bélaïr-Monange. Today, the 23.5-hectare vineyard boasts a melange of limestone and blue clay soils, producing wines of freshness, minerality, and elegance.

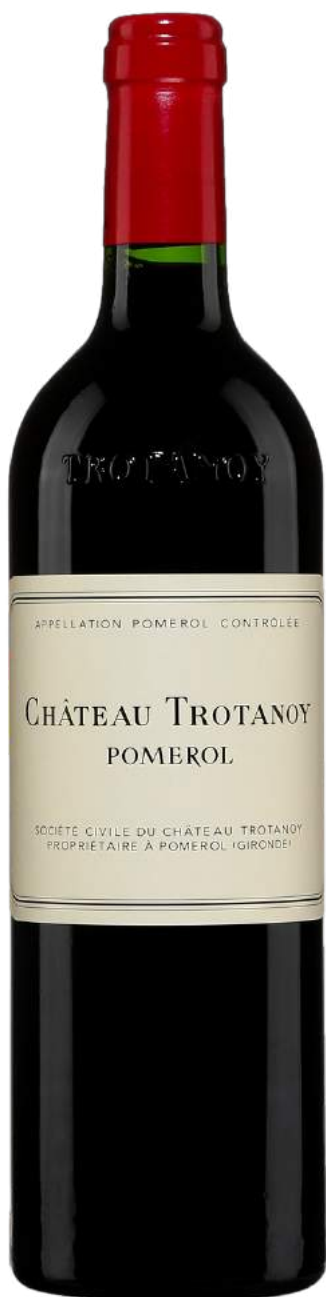
